

Alan Eusden is the chief operating officer of the Corning Museum of Glass (CMOG), leading the Museum's business operations with a strong emphasis on earned revenue and visitation. Before joining CMOG, Eusden held the role of chairman and president of Corning Display Technologies Taiwan. He held multiple financial roles and led several key business areas of Corning Incorporated since 1983, including leading the Corning Optical Fiber business from 1998 – 2002. Eusden has been active in numerous regional non-profits, serving on the boards of Elmira College, CMOG and Southern Tier Network.

Eusden is responsible for oversight of the earned income, community relations, hot glass, finance and human resource areas of the Museum.
